## Verbs: modals of probability

You *must* be the new sales assistant.

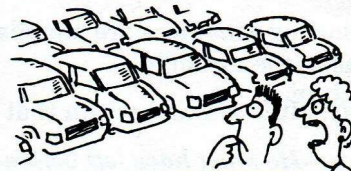
When we know that something is true, we use a normal present tense. (He *does* it, I *see* them, etc.) If we are not completely sure, we use a modal (*must*, *may*, *might*, *could*). The choice of modal depends on the degree of certainty, as in the following table.

PROBABILITY	VERB	EXAMPLE
100% almost certain quite likely 50% (possible) possible but unlikely highly unlikely 0%	present tense <i>must</i> <i>may</i> <i>could</i> <i>might</i> <i>can't/couldn't</i> present tense negative <div style="display: inline-block; vertical-align: middle; font-size: 3em; margin: 0 10px;">}</div> + infinitive	<i>She knows.</i> <i>It must be late.</i> <i>You may find this difficult.</i> <i>It could happen at any time.</i> <i>She might be waiting.</i> <i>You can't be serious.</i> <i>He doesn't know.</i>
